About the Programme

Democracy, governance, and development are integral to the progress of societies, each reinforcing the other in creating a just and equitable world. Democracy ensures citizen participation, accountability, and transparency, fostering trust in public institutions and enabling inclusive decision-making. Governance, as the framework of decision-making and implementation, determines the effectiveness of democratic systems in addressing social, economic, and environmental challenges. Development, as the desired outcome, focuses on improving quality of life, reducing inequalities and achieving sustainable growth.

This refresher course explores the interconnectedness of these concepts, emphasizing their role in addressing contemporary challenges such as corruption, inequality and weak institutional frameworks. It aims to highlight the importance of citizen-centric governance, the role of technology in improving transparency and strategies for achieving sustainable development goals. Participants will engage in discussions on diverse themes, including grassroots governance, public policy innovation and inclusive development.

The course also seeks to address pressing issues like the erosion of trust in democratic institutions, identity-based politics, and the growing influence of authoritarian tendencies. By analyzing best practices and fostering dialogue, the program aims to equip participants with the knowledge and tools to strengthen democratic governance and drive meaningful development in their respective spheres.

Objectives

The objectives of the refresher course are typically aimed at updating participants' knowledge, enhancing their skills and encouraging innovative approaches to teaching and research. Some key objectives might include:

- To explain the principles, processes and role of citizens of democracy. Studying and analyzing the structure and functioning of democratic institutions.
- To study transparency, accountability and participation as the basic pillars of good governance. Understand the role of technology and digital means in governance.
- To study and analyze efforts towards reducing socio-economic inequalities and empowering marginalized communities.
- To consider issues such as corruption, political instability and institutional weaknesses. Analyze the impact of diversity management and identity-based politics.
- To study successful models and policies for good governance and development. Measures to strengthen local self-government and people's participation.
- To develop strategies towards establishing a better relationship between citizens and the state.
